Dann is a business development manager at NSF International in Ann Arbor, MI. His focus is on two new NSF water programs; Building Water Health, and Cooling Towers. He is the ASPE Region 2 Affiliate Liaison, and a member of ASHRAE, ASHE, ASSE and the Eng Society of Detroit

This presentation follows processes and practices in NSF Standard 444 currently in development and co-sponsored by ASHRAE. While a municipal water distribution system is the major component in delivering safe drinking water to our citizens, in regards to water hazards related to public health, a building's water system is our last line of defense. Proper water management for building owners starts with a Water Safety Plan. We will discuss the microbial, chemical, and physical hazards associated with building water.

Mark Pfeifer from SPX Cooling Technologies provided some insightful suggestions on the most cost effective ways to produce chilled water. ASHRAE LEADERSHIP RECALL INTERVIEW

With Christopher Albright, P.E. Date of Interview: January 17, 2017 Interviewed by John Weiland, Johnstown Chapter Historian

Q.: How did you first become involved in ASHRAE?

A: I became a member of ASHRAE as a student of UPJ. Tom Sobieski was the teacher of the HVAC fundamentals course and his first item of business was to sign us all up to become student members. That was the first time I had ever heard of ASHRAE. It's all Tom's fault!

Q.: Having served many roles in both the Chapter and Region, what are you most proud of accomplishing?

A: I am most proud of being a part of a Chapter that despite its size continues to perform on par with Chapters many times larger. I am proud to be <u>among the group of individuals</u> who make that happen. It isn't about being recognized as an individual for me, it's about being part of a great team.

Q.: What are some of the professional benefits that you have experienced from your ASHRAE volunteering?

A: Involvement in the local ASHRAE chapter gives you an opportunity to step outside of your comfort level with minimal risk of catastrophic failure. For instance, if you aren't great at sales, you could take on the Membership Promotion Chair position and learn how to apply techniques to 'Sell' ASHRAE and attempt to gain additional Chapter members... and if you fail miserably, while there may be consequences, they aren't detrimental to life or treasure.

Q.: What advice would you give to an incoming ASHRAE Society President on improvements the organization could make?

A: I couldn't begin to understand the complications of that position.

Q.: Why would you recommend ASHRAE membership and involvement to individuals just starting out in the HVAC&R field?
