Started in HVAC industry in 1986. Pioneer of Ductless Split Systems in western PA since 1989, instrumental in growing product class though literally thousands of presentations to owners, architects, mechanical engineers, contractors and professional organizations. In 1993, Dave was fortunate enough to be involved in the first prototype installation of Variable Refrigerant Flow system in the United States in Pittsburgh PA, eight years later, (2001) he was a driving force in bringing this technology to western PA and has been enthralled by it ever since. He is a voting member of ASHRAE TC 8.7 and has presented numerous times at ASHRAE chapters, AIA and other professional organizations. Dave has contributed to ASHRAE Handbook VRF chapter and GPC 41 VRF guidelines draft committee.

A field savvy HVAC veteran with over 28 year's experience, Rick has over 5 years hands on field VRF experience. He has started up over 100 systems in those years. What is the RP Campaign?

The RP Campaign is an annual fundraising campaign benefiting the funding of numerous ASHRAE Programs. These programs include:

- ASHRAE Research
- ASHRAE Scholarships for undergraduate students
- ASHRAE Learning Institute (ALI) development of new courses & materials
- Graduate Research Projects (Grants-in-Aid)
